The specific duties a paraprofessional is allowed to perform is dependent on the level of his or her certification. This document outlines allowable duties for each level of certification. The next section explains the general roles and responsibilities of each person. The majority of this document explains the differences in the duties between the special education teacher and the paraprofessional in a general education setting, a special education setting, and in non-traditional settings, such as homebound or a community based facility. There are also sections on communication between all stakeholders, and much more.
